NOTICE OF PROPOSED ABANDONMENT OF PROPERTY

[This form may be used by a trustee or debtor in possession. Other parties seeking abandonment must file a motion to compel abandonment (\$150 filing fee required).]

Objection/Request for Hearing due:

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Trustee or Debtor in Possession is proposing to abandon property of the bankruptcy estate. Abandonment means that the property is being returned to the Debtor because the property cannot be liquidated for the benefit of creditors. The reason(s) for abandonment are stated below.

Your rights may be affected. You should read these papers carefully and discuss them with your attorney, if you have one in this bankruptcy case. (If you do not have an attorney, you may wish to consult one.) If you do not want the court to approve the proposed abandonment described below, or if you want the court to consider your views on this matter, **not later than 14 days after the mailing of this notice**, you or your attorney must file an objection or a written request for a hearing. Responses must be filed with the court at: **United States Bankruptcy Court, District of Hawaii, Suite 250, Honolulu, HI 96813**, and sent to the moving party at the address in the upper left corner of this document. If you mail your response to the court for filing, you must mail it early enough so the court will **receive** it on or before the deadline stated above.

If the court schedules a hearing, you will receive a separate notice of the hearing date and time. If you or your attorney do not file an objection or a request for a hearing, the court may decide that you do not oppose the proposed abandonment and may enter an order approving the transaction.
